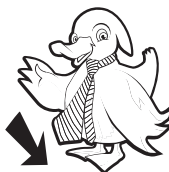
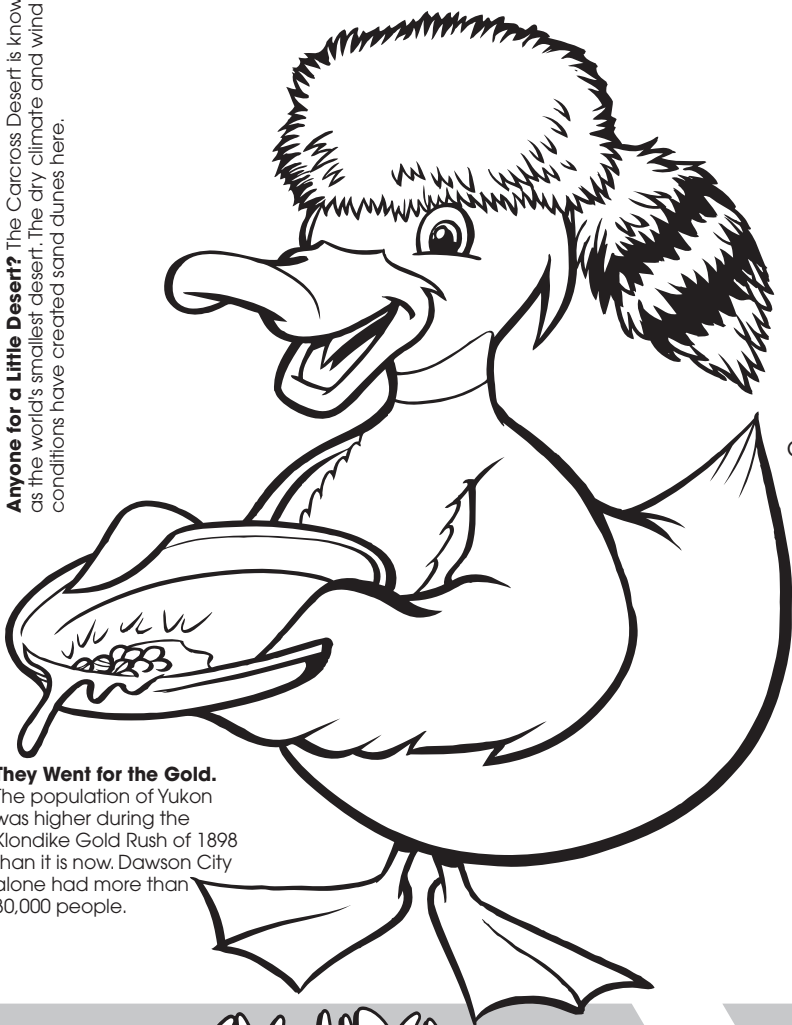


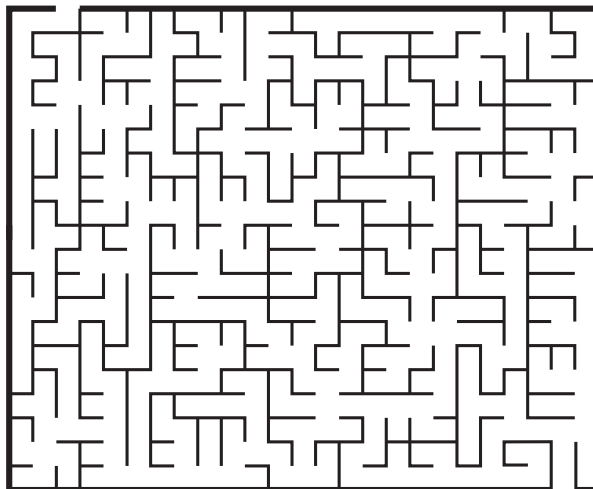
# Lewis The Duck in Yukon Territory Quacktivity Page
